6. In general, how can the periodic trends displayed by elements be explained? In other words, comment on how one uses the periodic table to visually explain the different trends discussed in this chapter.

7. Arrange the following elements in order of **decreasing** <u>atomic size</u>: sulfur, chlorine, aluminum, and sodium. Does your arrangement demonstrate a <u>periodic trend</u> or a <u>group trend</u>?

8. Which element in each pair has the larger first ionization energy?

- A. sodium, potassium
- B. magnesium, phosphorous
